SOLARIS. 1972. Mosfilm. Adapted and directed by Andrei Tarkovsky. Adapted from a book by Stanislas Lemm. Co-scriptwriter: Freidrich Gorenstein. Camera (Sovcolor) by Vadim Yusov. Music by Edward Artmeyev. English titles. 165 minutes.

Cast: Yuri Jarvet (Snaut), Nathlin Bondarchuk (Harey), Donatas Benionys (Kris), Anatoli Solinitsin (Sartorious), Vladislav Dvorjetzki (Burton), Nikolai Grinko (Father), Sos Sarkissian (Gibarian).

Tarkovsky, whose first film MY NAME IS IVAN (1962) has been released in America, and whose ANDREI ROUBLEV (1969) has not, is regarded as one of the most controversial and personal of directors in the Soviet Union. SOLARIS, his most recent work, is a "complex, deeply philosophical" tale set sometime in the near future.
