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





A Poet in the Cinema: Andrei Tarkovsky is a documentary worthy of its subject. Recently shown to much praise at the Cannes Film Festival, this study of the great Soviet filmmaker is the next best thing to having a new film from the director himself. In it he talks more openly than ever before about his life, career and ideas. The man who made André Roublev, Solaris, The Mirror, Stalker and Nostalgia gives us greater understanding of those films by talking about his own childhood. The effect that his father had (he left when Andrei was very young), his relationship with his mother, the marks of the difficult years of World War II, his time as a simple worker in Siberia, his studies of art and music, all can be seen in his films. His ideas about childhood, both in his own films and in this documentary, are fascinating "childhood is the driving force of my creative activity"). Director Donatella Baglivo, who codirected Montgomery Clift shown in Filmex 83, has made a film that is genuinely valuable. As Tarkovsky says in her film, "the cinema is not a profession, it's my life. And each film is an act of my life."

DONATELLA BAGLIVO

At the age of 13 Donatella Baglivo is already working with the moviola. At 15 she gets her diploma as fashion designer, while continuing her studies to become an accountant. In 1964, at the age of 18, she edits her first full-length film. In 1968 she sets up "Ciak Studio", her own company, and starts her cooperation with the Italian Radio and Television Corporation.


Editor, assistant director, producer: little by little Donatella Baglivo becomes known also abroad. Among many other things in 1979 she co-produces with RAI a special programme on Greek director Anghelopulos.

In 1980 she makes a biography on the great French stage writer Eugène Ionesco. In 1981 she completes a series of films on the American Stars of the '50s and 60' — Marlon Brando, Montgomery Clift and James Dean — which are aired in 1983 by the Italian Television under the title "The Hollywood Rebels".

In 1982 she completes "Cinema is a mosaic made of time".

In 1983 she directs the film "Andrey Tarkovsky in Nostalghia".

At present she has just finished her last film "Andrey Tarkovsky", the story of a poet in the cinema, the only biography of its kind ever made in the world.
