



Alexei and the Spring

MOTOHASHI Seiichi and Ryuichi SAKAMOTO present

Five years after the acclaim for "Nadya's Village" at the Berlin Film Festival.

The tale of another village - and its spring - comes to life.

MOTOHASHI Seiichi's photography, Ryuichi SAKAMOTO's music resonate together in one film.

THE SETTING: The village of BUDISCHE, in the Chechersk district of Gomel Region, Republic of BELARUS

Summer 2000 - Motohashi Seiichi sets to work on his second film, "Alexei and the Spring". The film is set in Budische, a small village in the same disaster-stricken area of Belarus as "Nadya's Village". A village with a spring, where but a handful of elderly residents remain.

The film is scheduled to open in Spring 2002. Five years after "Nadya's Village", a new legend begins.

THE SYNOPSIS

The Republic of Belarus, with its lush virgin forest and fertile soil, is known as "White Russia". The worst nuclear accident in human history, Chernobyl (formerly part of the Soviet Union, now in the Republic of Ukraine), spewed radioactive contamination across these lands.

An evacuation advisory was issued to southeastern Belarus, and most of the six hundred residents of Budische left their village, but fifty-five elderly people and one youth, Alexei, remained.

The forests surrounding the village, the farmlands, and their crops were all contaminated. Miraculously, the spring at the heart of the village still brings forth pure, uncontaminated water - water that shows absolutely no trace of radioactivity. The villagers believe one-hundred-year-old water flows from its source.

The film tells of the villagers and the spring, quietly portraying "richness in life".

THE DIRECTOR: MOTOHASHI Seiichi

Photographer, Film Director (1940 ~)

1991 (Five years after the nuclear accident) began photographing Chernobyl and its surrounds, producing four photo-collections and two films ("Nadya's Village" and "Alexei and the Spring") on the subject to date (2002).

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The village stood on a gentle hill in the midst of the forest, in a region designated a "mandatory evacuation" area. All the young families had departed, but fifty or so elderly people and thirty-four-year-old Alexei - were still living there humbly.

At the center of the village, framed by heavy logs, was the spring. "That spring water is from one-hundred years ago", called out an old man reaping hay nearby. "One hundred year-old water?!" He told me that the spring gushes forth rainwater that has circulated underground for one hundred years. The villagers wash mushrooms at the spring, do their laundry, and draw their daily drinking water from its source, skillfully bringing up bucketfuls with their carrying poles. In spring, the water is ladled on beet and cabbage shoots, one by one.

Life emanates from the spring, and is regenerated by it. In this village, one truly feels that people and living things are all part of the great cycle of Nature. I decided to shoot my second film in this village - Budische. Shooting began in midsummer, and ended in snow-covered midwinter, during which the village revealed a wide range of expressions.
