Les Blank follows Herzog around Berkeley on the day of the event, capturing his less-than-pleased consumption of his shoe, which he stuffs with onions and garlic and boils in duck fat to make it palatable. The film is completly humorous, and gives Blank a chance to poke some fun at his own obsession with food and eating.
