A Ministry Deputy and his wife have been invited to an official government reception. Upon their return, they discover that they do not have their keys. The couple has become accustomed to being under constant surveillance, but this time something else is going on. The husband realizes that his position is unstable and begins to panic. A marital argument reveals a serious crisis in their relationship as well as the inescapable nature of their situation. The ubiquitous "ear" listens and takes notes... The film was not screened in theaters until 1990. Only after so many years was the audience given an opportunity to see how effective an account of the totalitarian system had been written and filmed before the era of "Normalization." Jirina Bohdalova and Radoslav Brzobohaty make full use of this acting opportunity— it is a sharne that no one was allowed to know about if for so long.
