STORY:

Akira Kurosawa's SEVEN SAMURAI, generally regarded as one of the great humanistic action epics in the annals of film, is in re-release with a newly created soundtrack in four-track surround stereo, and a newly-struck, full-length, uncut print.

Starring the late Takashi Shimura as the samurai leader and the legendary Toshiro Mifune as an ex-farmer who wants to become a warrior, SEVEN SAMURAI relates the story of seven marauding samurai who are hired by a farming village to defend their town from bandits' attacks.

The new stereo soundtrack has been recorded with state-of-the-art sound equipment by Lion's Gate Studios in Hollywood, and will be shown in its full 1:33 format image complementing the stereo soundtrack.
