To commemorate the very first series presented by Cinematheque Ontario, a complete retrospective of the films of Pier Paolo Pasolini, we are fortunate to have a brand new 35mm print of this sumptuous work from his "Trilogy of Pleasure." Drunk on its own visual splendour and heady sensuality, THE ARABIAN NIGHTS illustrates Pasolini's belief that sex is the conduit to the sacred. Shot in the mirrored palaces, labyrinthine streets, the hubbub bazaars and water-cooled cloisters of Yemen, Nepal, Iran, and Ethiopia, NIGHTS employs Scheherezade's stories to explore the "idyllic sexuality" Pasolini sought in countries unsullied by European culture. Intoxicating in its eroticism – it fairly gleams with bronzed flesh – THE ARABIAN NIGHTS was to be the director's "final elegiac tribute to a force he then considered, along with the redeeming power of art, to be a vital civilizing presence in the modern world" (Peter Bondanella).
