Sjöberg's most ambitious film pioneered techniques which later became the common property of other filmmakers. The film is composed of three distinct parts: the prologue, in Gevacolor, is treated à la Brecht like a popular ballad sheet tracing the story of how a little peasant girl became first the mistress and then the Queen of Erik XIV; the central section is made up of scenes from Strindberg's play Erik XIV; the epilogue deals with Karin's exile and flight. In its scope and grandeur, its tenderness, magnificent acting, and dynamic narrative style, this is Sjöberg at his best.
