



On the island of Trang off the mainland of Denmark, bearded Thor Goat (Hans W. Petersen), despite his age, has become irresistible to women.

Thor derives this magnetism from sucking Trang's raw eggs. After draining an egg to its shell, Thor gives sound to his amatory feelings. With his face to the sky, he sets off love calls that inflame women in the entire community and bring many of them running to his side.

Even genteel Edith Paste (Ghita Norby), the wife of the new vicar, Paul Paste (Paul Hagen), is affected. She turns her feelings towards the vicar for relief, but he doesn't seem to comprehend.

Thor's son, Angelus Goat (Dirch Passer), does not possess his father's talents nor is he aware of his father's erotic powers.

Angelus is a political idealist, fighting for love, truth and right on Trang. His goal is to become Chairman of the Parish Council on the island.

He is opposed in this by the incumbent, Per Mortensen (Karl Stegger). Mortensen, it so happens, is Trang's only egg wholesaler and exporter.

With Thor's help among the women, and the assistance of a faithful disciple, Simon (Ove Sprogoe), Angelus Goat is triumphant in the election campaign and leads his party, "Blessed Be Our Bliss," to victory.

Even Per Mortensen's powerful friends, among them Trommesen (Gunnar Lemvigh), an influential Member of Parliament on the mainland, cannot save him from being swept out of office.

Flushed with victory and his ideals, Angelus leads Trang into secession from Denmark and the establishment of a separate and independent state with its own flag, own currency and even its own armed forces, consisting mainly of a few bumbling and stumbling recruits.

Ove Bierman (Kjeld Petersen), a newspaper reporter, getting wind of what has been happening, visits Trang and then flashes the news to the world.

Recovering somewhat from its consternation, the government in Copenhagen dispatches Miss Bertha Virginius, Minister for Foreign Affairs (Bodil Steen), to look into the matter, quell the insurrection, and bring Trang back to Denmark.

In the meantime, Per Mortensen collects a group of comic counter-revolutionaries to try to wrest back power from Angelus Goat.

What with the arrival of stern-visaged Miss Virginius, the Minister for Foreign Affairs, and the countermilitary measures of Per Mortensen, Angelus Goat sees his idealistic party in jeopardy.

However, Simon conspires with Thor Goat to exert his amatory powers over the female foreign minister. Thor prepares for his duties with an abundance of fresh Trang eggs. His love call overpowers the foreign minister, and she falls to his charms.

Angelus is triumphant. Through Greta (Lone Hertz), a blonde Trang charmer, he discovers for himself the potent magical powers of the eggs of Trang. In fact, he becomes his father's successor, for Thor is persuaded by the foreign minister to leave the island with her to return to Copenhagen.

Stage an "Egg Festival Week" with the slogan, EGGS FOR GO-POWER! GO-SEE "CRAZY PARADISE" FOR ENTERTAINMENT! Time the week to coincide with the opening of "Crazy Paradise" at your theatre.

"Crazy Paradise," throughout the picture, raises a high quotient of egg consciousness. This is your premise for the "Egg Festival Week."

Tie-in with every phase of egg interests. Amenable to this should be egg producers, feed interests, retailers and wholesalers. In addition, there are packagers, truckers, etc.

- Try for one big super-market chain to be the focus of the campaign.
- Seek store exterior and interior displays promoting eggs and "Crazy Paradise" and your playdate.
- You can plant discount coupons to your show or free passes in egg paskages

Make up a board for exploitation out front of still pictures of the good-looking women to be seen in "Crazy Paradise."


If you wish, utilize the story on this subject to be found in the pressbook as part of your board.

- Make generous use of egg-prickers with appropriate playdate info.
- With super-market co-op, place prize passes in plastic egg shells.
- Imprint or snipe, signs on egg trays and packages.
- Again with cooperation of all egg interests involve city officials in celebration.
- Plant egg interest personalities on radio and television and position them for newspaper interviews.
- Invite all these people to special screenings of "Crazy Paradise."

Axel originally was an actor who received his early training at the Royal Theatre School in Copenhagen from 1942 to 1945. Earlier he lived in France for a number of years and went to school in Paris.

Since 1945 he produced many plays in Copenhagen, including "Le Cid" by Corneille, "Lucretia" by Girardoux and "The Head of The Others" by Marcel Ayme. He also produced about 40 television plays, including works by Moliere, Dostoevski and other great writers.

"Crazy Paradise," which is in color, is the last of ten films Axel has directed and the first to reach the United States as a Sherpix release.

SPICE, SATIRE, ROBUST COMEDY

The film brings to us comedy talents which, from all accounts, are going to make their mark here for the future.


The stars are Dirch Passer, Hans W. Petersen, Ove Sprogoe and Ghita Norby.

The picture on which it is based was produced in color.




EGG-PICKERS GIVE-AWAY






Petersen is seen in the role of Thor Goat, a man who is made irresistible to women by drinking the magical raw eggs of the island of Trang.


