Colorful Role For Versatile European Actor, Ludwig Stossel

Ludwig Stossel, one of the screen's most versatile character actors, may not be able to explain in great detail Einstein's theory of relativity, but he certainly has an intimate knowledge of the man who expounded the theory.

Stossel, who currently plays one of the featured character roles in Republic's "The Sun Shines Bright," directed by John Ford and now showing at the Theatre, actually portrayed the notable Professor Einstein in the film, "The Beginning or the End." The actor's impersonations of famous people doesn't stop there either, for he also ap-

peared as Lou Gehrig's father in "Pride of the Yankees."

A product of the European stage, Stossel was prominent on the legitimate circuits in Berlin and Vienna and at the festivals in Salzburg before launching a film career in England.

In 1939 the actor was brought to Hollywood and has appeared in many of the cinema city's most important films since.
