One of the least known but most brilliant film makers to produce "B" films was Edgar G. Ulmer. Bluebeard is an example of his genius. It is a suspenseful film about a young Parisian who suspects a handsome puppeteer, Morel (Carradine), of being the murderer Bluebeard. The tragic atmosphere of the film is sympathetic towards Morel, who against his own will nearly strangles the woman he loves before falling to his death in the Seine. A highpoint in the film is a vivid puppet performance of "Faust," which is the film's literary metaphor. The Caligari-type sets are shot with dramatic force using excellent expressionistic carmerawork . . . all done on the skimpiest budget imaginable.
