

Synopsis

Sure to arouse controversy, Jennifer Montgomery's bravely autobiographical film takes a disquietingly original slant on underage sex. A 14-year-old starts an affair with her dorm counselor, who's into photographing his students in the nude. It's a relationship that won't stand still for parental interference or even investigation by the FBI, some years later. The director's deadpan, seemingly objective style deliberately downplays the outré subject matter and leaves the viewer to decide what is meant by the age of consent. A truly radical investigation of what's natural in sexuality—and what's not.

Director's Statement

In 1989 I was harassed by the FBI. They were attempting to exact testimony from me in a much-publicized case against an alleged child pornographer. As one of the photographic subjects in question, I have my own perverse angle on the case and the surrounding storm of controversy.

The story is a kind of boarding school melodrama tracing the development of my relationship to this man, and pausing along the way to look at the complicated issue of the age of consent.
