Deszo Magyar's *The Agitators* was shown for the first time outside of Hungary at the AFI LA FilmFest in 1988, after having been banned for 19 years. We were very proud to have shown the film at that time, and given the theme of this year's festival, have chosen to present it again, giving the film a chance to been seen alongside other once-banned Eastern European films. It is March, 1919, in Hungary. Due to peculiar historical circumstances, a group of young revolutionaries is given the chance to run the country, to create an ideal Council-Republic for the working classes. The story of their short-lived (90 days) revolution is a metaphor for the student revolutions of 1968. Magyar is currently the



Director of the AFI's Center for Advanced Film and Television Studies, and will attend the screening and discuss his film.
