



Sixteen women were killed in Mashad, Iran over the space of one year. Most of the victims had been previously incarcerated on prostitution or drug related charges. The Iranian press called the cases the "spider killings" because the victims were drawn like flies into the murderer's web. One year after the first killing, Saeed Hanaei, a 39-year-old builder, was arrested and confessed to killing the women. Hanaei claimed that the killings were in accordance with the Islamic teaching of preventing vice and promoting virtue. While reformists in Iran asked for the swift punishment of the killer, hardliners hailed the spider killings as cleansing society of corrupt elements. Through exclusive interviews with the killer, his family and the family of the victims, \$And Along Came a Spider\$ is a brave look at the complexities of Iranian society and the different forces active within the country. The documentary touches upon issues such as religious fanaticism, prostitution, discrimination against women, drug addiction, and many other contradictions within the Islamic Republic of Iran.
