Alexandria Encore tells of a violent dispute between a film director, played by Youssef Chahine himself, and his favourite actor, Amr (Amr Abdel Guelil). The dispute leads the director to rethink his life, and when he does he discovers that nothing is as it seemed in the past - his cinema, his country, or anything else. Alexandria Encore completes the trilogy started with Alexandria, Why? in 1979 and continued with The Memory in 1982. A director's director, Chahine is concerned with his art and the power it can give him. 'What's the relationship between a director and his actors, a country in crisis, Alexandria, Cleopatra, the building of a light house at Alexandria, Hamlet, a strike and love?' is the question that Chahine says must be addressed and asked of his latest work.
