With this extraordinary film, the best-known Venezuelan director, Diego Risquez, has completed the trilogy begun with Simón Bolivar (1969) and continued with Orinoko Nuevo Mundo (1984). As with his previous works. Risquez chose to shoot the film in small-gauge and to blow it up to 35mm to achieve a very seductive and intriguing visual and narrative texture. With virtually no dialogue, his vibrant images show the rape and plunder of every object, plant and mineral, including man himself. The strength of the thread running through the trilogy is now finally proven beyond a reasonable doubt. If Simón showed Latin America and its history as Europeans liked to see them and Orinoko is the anarchic impression they have of themselves, then America contains the vision of the Latin Americans projecting back into Europe what they see in us. In France Risquez's films have turned out to be reasonably commercial as well as 'culturally significant' - which proves that it's worth taking a few Risquez.-Don Ranvaud.
