



Above is shown an American or British teacher, instructing a class of Indian workers in the higher industrial techniques, an indication of the progressive outlook, which has swept over India's millions, organized to meet the needs of war, and conscious that these developing skills will be available to India when peace comes.

Below is shown a less attractive picture—a review at Singapore of the troops of Japan's puppet, Subhas Chandra Bose, who has sought to enlist India's discontented to the Axis cause. "WHEN ASIA SPEAKS"... A boldly impartial survey of the currents at work in the Asia of today, telescoped into twenty minutes of documentary film. The film shows the propaganda of the Japanese on the continent of Asia, their attempt to win conquered territories by wiles and cajolery to a Japanese-controlled "Asia For the Asiatics;" it shows cooperation between Hindus and British in war time industries, industries that can be turned to the good of all India when peace comes; it shows the landmarks of Japanese aggression in China, the temporary cave dwellings and the heroic resistance of the Chinese people, the rising tide of Chinese aspiration to make China one of the world's great economic powers.

A straight statement is made of the Western stake in the economic resources of the East; just as revealing a statement shows the potentialities of air cooperation.

The post-war problem of the future relationship of the East and West is today of constantly increasing news interest. Screen the picture for the commentators, news columnists and international reporters, who are now voicing their opinions in every newspaper and radio station. It will provide them with a wealth of factual material.

Pose the question: Can East and West remain partners in peace as they are now in war, in the building of the new world?

"When Asia Speaks" contains the answers to many questions which all have been asking, and for the first time shows the progressive outlook, which has swept over the peoples of India and China that may bring the East and the West together in the time to come.

### The New And Old East

The illustrations of scenes in "WHEN ASIA SPEAKS" symbolize the changes which are taking place in the Orient that forecast a renaissance and a modernization of these ancient lands. At top is a scene in an Indian school, where an American teacher is instructing a class in the culinary art of the Western Hemisphere. Below is a view of Chinese coolies leveling off an air-field for the most modern of machines in the way that their ancestors have done similar work for a thousand years. At bottom a class of Indian children is shown receiving their first lessons in English. With allied troops now landing on the soil of Asia, the Pacific powers of North America—the U.-S. They know that India's industry now employs twice as many men as did the pre-war factories of the United States. They know all this new strength will be available to

India in peace.
Similarly, China's war time effort is seen as the first step in the building of a great industrial state.
The interest of all demand that the war time partners of East and West, shall be partners in the days


### **Watch China!**


### Jap Bunk







