THE FILMS OF INGMAR BERGMAN

THREE STRANGE LOVES, 4:30, 7:45, 11:00**

This odd, complex film, written not by Bergman but by Herbert Grevenius (based on a novel by Birgit Tengroth), tells the intertwining stories of the lives and loves of three women. There is a hysterical young wife unable to bear children, a disturbed widow in the hands of a cruel psychiatrist, and a lesbian dancer who sets her sights on the widow. Bergman himself is seen briefly in a scene in a train corridor when he passes two conversing Swedish ministers.
