"THE WURDALAK"

While riding through the mountain regions of eastern Europe, a young nobleman, Vladimir D'Urfe (MARK DAMON), comes upon a horse carrying the recently decapitated body of a man. He leads the horse and its grisly burden to a nearby mysterious farmhouse inhabited by a fear-ridden family group — Peter, George, George's wife, Martha, her little boy, Ivan, and their youngsister, Sdenka. Peter and George identify the headless body as that of the bandit, Alibek, and drive a sword through the heart of the corpse.

They explain that this is done to prevent it from becoming a wurdalak, which are vampire corpses that are thirsty for the blood of the living, "of those they have loved most dearly." They further explain that the more a wurdalak has loved someone, the more it thirsts for that person's blood . . . children, relatives, dearest friends . . . and whomever they kill for this craving also becomes a wurdalak unless a stake is driven through the heart.

The family then explains that they fear for their father, Gorca (BORIS KARLOFF) who before going away to kill Alibek, had warned that if more than five days pass before his return, he will have become a wurdalak. While they wait, Vladimir and Sdenka become attracted to each other and then, at the exact hour marking he passage of five days, Gorca returns carrying with him the decapitated head of Alibek.

It is aparent that a change has come over the old man and we soon learn that he has indeed become a wurdalak when he kills Peter and flees with little Ivan in his arms. Vladimir sees Gorca leave with the child and rouses the family but too late. Later they find Ivan, killed like the others, a gaping wound in the neck—the mark of the wurdalak.

Vladimir and Sdenka confirm their love and the young noble asks her to go away with him, far from the cursed farmhouse. Meanwhile the bloody work of the wurdalak continues with first Martha and then George, killed and emptied of their blood as Vladimir and Sdenka seek refuge in an old convent many miles from the scene. But Gorca comes after his last loved one and claims Sdenka, who in turn kills an unsuspecting Vladimir while locked in an embrace, bringing the wurdalak cycle to its horrible climax.

#### "THE DROP OF WATER"

Helen Corey, a nurse goes grumblingly to the aid of elderly Madame Perkins, but when she arrives the old woman is dead looking as if she died of fright. Helen steals a large diamond ring from the finger of the corpse and puts it on her own finger when she gets home. That night she is haunted by the sound of dripping water and, though she turns off the faucet, the dripping continues and gradually terrorizes her. The culmination comes in alternate periods of silence and dripping then she sees the ghost of Mrs. Perkins, its face contorted in a grimace of disgust, which descends upon Helen to put dead hands about her throat. When the police find Helen's body, they diagnose the death as a heart attack and discover her finger discolored as if a ring had been torn from it.

#### "THE TELEPHONE"

Rosy, a lovely lady-about-town, receives a mysterious series of telephone calls one night as she is alone in her apartment. At first there is no one on the line, but in later calls a man's voice speaks ultimately and admiringly of her body, driving her to fear and distraction. The calls continue and then start to threaten her life. This time Rosy telephones her girl friend, Mary, and asks that she stay with her until the danger passes. We then learn that the man is one whom Rosy had betrayed and sent to prison. While Rosy is asleep, the escaped convict slips into the apartment and strangles Mary, thinking it is Rosy. When he discovers his mistake and turns to kill the sleeping Rosy, the police break in just in time to save her.

#### BORIS KARLOFF RETURNS IN TERROR CLASSIC MUCH LIKE "FRANKENSTEIN," "DRACULA"

After more than thirty years as star of terror films a career launched by his Monster in "Frankenstein," Boris Karloff finally gets a chance to match "Dracula," his main terror competitor through the years.


Boris' portrayal of the "wurdalak"
— the vampire who kills only those he loves — is sure to be ranked with Lugosi's Count Dracula as a nightmare-producing menace. His new terror portrayal receives added dimensions of terror through wide screen and color — unknown in the days of "Frankenstein" and "Dracula."

Born William Henry Pratt in Dulwich, England, on November 23, 1887, Boris was the youngest of nine children of Edward Pratt, a government civil servant. As he progressed with his education and his family's

with his education and his family's determination to steer him to a consular career became stronger, Boris decided to disappear for a while to avoid a family quarrel over his future.

So it was that in 1909, without a word as to his destination, Boris journeyed to Canada where he found a job as a farmhand in eastern Ontario and then a year later moved west to Vancouver, British Columbia, where he worked as a laborer and logger.

In 1910 he decided to discard the name of Pratt and adopt his mother's family name of Karloff, adding Boris because it seemed to fit.

He then worked with a variety of touring theatrical stock companies until he arrived in Hollywood in 1918 where he made his film debut as an extra. This first appearance was as one of the many Mexican bandits in "His Majesty the American," starring Douglas Fairbanks.

It was while working in the film, "Graft," at Universal thirteen years later, that Boris got the break that was to make his name synonymous with motion picture chills. He was eating at the studio commissary when the director of "Frankenstein" met Boris for the first time and "discovered" him for the Monster.

His role as the Monster in "Frankenstein" and in the two subsequent sequels won him acclaim as the greatest terror character actor in motion pictures and he was hailed as the successor to the late Lon Chaney. With a quick succession of terror roles, although he never again appeared as a Monster, Boris maintained his reputation as a convincing exponent of fearsome character roles.

In 1941, he broke with Hollywood to go to the New York stage where he created another memorable role, as Jonathan in "Arsenic and Old Lace." He appeared in the play a record 1400 times before he left the cast to return to Hollywood to star in "The Climax."

More successful pictures and plays followed, with Boris shuttling back and forth between Broadway and Hollywood. Most prominent of his successes were the motion pictures "Bedlam," "Tap Roots" and "Tower of London" and, on the stage, "Peter Pan," "The Linden Tree" and as Cauchon opposite Julie Harris in "The Lark."

After the war he extended his field into television to which he devoted himself exclusively from 1958 until his return to films in "The Raven" for American International. He moved to London where he made his first starring television series "Colonel March of Scotland Yard" and in 1960-61 he commuted back and forth to Hollywood to make his most recent TV series, "Thriller."

Karloff, a cultured, soft-spoken English gentleman of real life, married Evelyn Hope in 1946. He has a 23-year-old daughter by a previous marriage who now is the wife of an American Air Force officer.

His chief interests are flower gardens, poetry, the legitimate stage and world affairs. He also is an avid fan and follower of the English spectator sports, cricket and rugby football.

#### VAMPIRE LEGENDS ARE OLD, GLOBAL SUPERSTITIONS

Belief in vampires — actually a belief in the "undead" — derives from that facet of witchcraft which claims that evil exists and persists even unto the grave and beyond. #### AS STAR OF NEW TERROR THRILLER, "BLACK SABBATH" MARK DAMON SCORES AGAIN

Mark Damon continues his fast pace toward top stardom with another memorable leading man portrayal in American International's "Black Sabbath." He stars with Boris Karloff and Michele Mercier in the color and

Bigger roles, with acting and singing combined, followed and he determined that he would finish school and start the serious study of dramatics.

He enrolled with famed drama coach Sanford Meisner and worked hard to perfect his acting and in a brief span of time forged ahead to win recognition as one of the most promising young actors in Hol- he recently signed with Wynne lywood with important roles in films,


on the stage and in television. His first big motion picture break was in American International's Edgar Allan Poe classic, "The House of Usher." Since then he has starred in top TV dramatic shows and in AIP's "The Young Racers."

Now, with stardom in his grasp, Mark recalls that he actually was "discovered" long before he decided to make acting his career. He likes to remember that red letter day, while in high school and working in a children's amusement park, a stranger approached him and said that he had potentialities for motion pictures.

The man said that his brother was a theatrical agent and gave him a card, reading "Gummo Marx." Mark had been talking to Groucho

#### MICHELE MERCIER BIDS FOR "MOST BEAUTIFUL VAMPIRE" AWARD IN "BLACK SABBATH"

From "petite rat" (little mouse) to "wurdalak" (vampire) marks the current status of the meteoric film career of lovely Michele Mercier. Michele, who started out as "petite rat" appears as a deceivingly beauti-

ful "wurdalak" in her latest starring her film career. motion picture, American International's "Black Sabbath." Also starring in the color chiller, opening ..... at the ...... Theatre,

are Boris Karloff and Mark Damon. The bright-eyed, raven-haired beauty was born in Nice, France, on New Year's Day and made her entertainment world debut at the age of eight as a "petite rat" in the corps de ballet of the Nice Opera. Eight years later she went to Paris to become the premiere danseuse in the Ballet Company of the Eiffel Tower.

Returning to Nice for a vacation, she was spotted by French film director Denys de La Patelliere during a visit to her father's pharmacy. He though she was a salesgirl and signed her for an important role in his "Retour de Manivelle" to launch

Since then Michele has appeared in a steady succession of French and Italian pictures. Her first American film, which appeared earlier this year, was opposite Bob Hope in "A Global Affair."

Michele and her husband, director Andre Smagghe, live in a villa on a small island in the River Seine, some nine miles from Paris. There she keeps her two dogs, has a garden and fruit trees and indulges in her hobbies of horseback riding and swimming.

Her favorite authors are Hemingway, Faulkner and Colette and she speaks and reads in English and Italian in addition to her native French. Michele wants to live in Southern California, particularly the coastal areas which remind her of Nice and the French Riviera.

#### **WURDALAK IS ODD VARIETY** OF BLOOD-SUCKING **GHOSTS KNOWN AS VAMPIRES**

After an absence from the screen for many years, American International's "Black Sabbath" brings back the feared vampire, an odd variety known as a "wurdalak," in a story that brings back memories of such classic chilers as "Dracula" and "Frankenstein."

Boris Karloff portrays the feared wurdalak — a vampire that only drinks the blood of those it loves in the color and scope terror thriller. Mark Damon and Michele Mercier also star in "Black Sabbath" which opens ..... at

the ..... theatre. "Vampire" is a term generally applied to blood-sucking ghosts, one of the forms which the legendary "undead" take. The word is of Slavic origin and comes from the Hungarian or Magyar word "vampyr." In its original meaning it is a living corpse or soul-less body that comes from its burial place at night and drinks the blood of the living. The symbol of the vampire is the bat.

There is an old Scottish superstition that when bats rise and descend again to earth while cying, the witches' hour has arrived and the witches are free to create their

In Hungary in the 18th century the uproar about vampires was as great as that during the witch hunts in New England in colonial America. Means of preventing the dead from injuring the living were then evolved and are still prevalent among the Slavonic peoples.

The vampire, so they insist, cannot rest in its grave but must spend the night searching for a victim, Then, when the sun rises or the bells ringin the morning, it must return to its coffin.

The people who live in the lower Danube region believe that persons who were witches during their lifetime, were cursed by their parents or by the Church or had committed suicide or met violent death, were more likely to be victims and thus become vampires themselves.

According to legend, anyone bitten by a vampire becomes one upon death. Vampires are also created if a cat or other evil creature jumps or flies over the corpse before it is buried.



#### **ANCIENT RULES** TELL HOW TO WARD OFF **WURDALAKS**, **VAMPIRES**

Lest you be troubled by realistic nightmares about wudalaks and other vampires after seeing American International's "Black Sabbath," there is a complete set of ancient, proven rules to prevent such creatures from bothering you.

The wurdalak is the uncommon variety of vampire examined closely in the color and scope terror chiller which opens ..... at

the ..... theatre. Boris Karloff portrays the chief wurdalak - a variety which drinks only the blood of those it loves with Mark Damon and Michele Mercier also starring as ill-fated lovers.

Here now is the ancient way to prevent all varieties of vampires:

If a corpse about to be buried has its mouth open, it will probably become a vampire, and its mouth must be stuffed with clay before the coffin is closed. If it is suspected that a certain corpse already buried is a vampire, it must be dug up and examined. If it proves to be unnaturally ruddy and fresh in appearance with blood-stains on the mouth, it is a vampire, for no sign of decay will touch the body of a vampire.

Certain measures must then be taken, both to protect the living and to give release to the unholy, earthbound vampire. All of this must be done during the light of day when the vampire has returned to its coffin; for by night it rises from the grave with superhuman power and eerie cunning. It must be decapitated and buried, burned at a crossroads, have a wooden stake driven through the body, usually the heart; or the left eye must be pierced with a spike. The body will twist in agony as the stake pierces it but afterward it will be in peace.

Also effective against vampires are light, bells, iron, garlic, spittle, thistle and above all, the crucifix. The crucifix, being the sign of Life, of the Christ, is the most hateful thing to vampires who worship Satan or the Devil. The crucifix worn about the neck is one of the most effective protections as the vampire cannot bear to look upon it. Against witchcraft in general the sign of the cross is most powerful, as are horse shoes, spittle, silver and rowan wood.





■ A most unusual and effective promotion for "Black Sabbath," recommended for use approximately a week before the opening, is distribution of a special "wurdalak" kit to local motion picture editors, columnists, TV and radio commentators and disc jockeys composed of the following:

 The pressbook publicity stories explaining that "wurdalak" is a special kind of vampire, giving the background of vampire superstitions and explaining about preventing vampires. Mimeograph these background feature stories so that they can be used by the recipients.

An envelope or small bag labeled "Your Personal Black Sabbath"
 Wurdalak Preventative Kit" and containing three or more of the
 following: toothpick stake, miniature flashlight, small mirror, mini ature bell, piece of iron (scrap), clove of garlic, and guest
 ticket to "Black Sabbath" theatre.

The results almost surely will be a mention of receipt of the kit with full picture credit in the form of a feature story, column item or other plug.




"Black Sabbath" lends itself to special theatre fronts and displays, with loudspeakers playing the effective radio spots over and over again to attract attention and sell seats.

- The name of Boris Karloff is most important to the attraction of "Black Sabbath" and variety of contests can be set up with local newspapers, radio or TV personalities asking for lists of his motion pictures and roles. Prizes to be passes to see film.
- Since the radio and TV spots for "Black Sabbath" are powerful "seat-sellers," set your schedules as far in advance as possible to get best time spots to sell the thriller. These spots are especially effective since they feature the voice of Boris Karloff at its most terrifying best.
- A surefire publicity stunt is to advertise for or via publicity stories, call for volunteers to sit alone in the theatre through a screening of "Black Sabbath" as a test for bravery.
