
'BWANA DEVIL' BASED ON TRUE TALE OF FEAR

3-D SHOOTING BETTER THAN 2-D

To the delight and surprise of the crew, photographing in Natural Vision three dimension proved to be as fast and as easy—and sometimes faster and easier—then conventional motion picture photography.

"Bwana Devil," which stars Robert Stack, Barbara Britton and Nigel Bruce, tells the dramatic story of two man-eating lions which prevented the building of a railroad in central Africa.

Radio Writer

Arch Oboler, brilliant producer-director and "Master of the Unusual," whose "Bwana Devil," the world's first Natural Vision three-dimensional film, which currently is spellbinding audiences at the Theatre, originally achieved his world-wide reputation as this country's top author of original plays for radio production.

'Bwana Devil,' First Full-Length Feature in 3-D And in Color, To Have Local Premiere

(General Advance)

The idea of three-dimensional movies is not new—since the late Twenties, all sorts of experiments have been under way to find the proper way to present 3-D to movie audiences.

"It presented some tremendous technical problems," explains famed Hollywood cinemaphotographer Joseph Biroc. "With the presentation of Arch Oboler's "Bwana Devil," these obstacles have finally been overcome, and we have a radical innovation that I think will astound viewers and cause a complete re-examination of our movie-making techniques.

The 3D camera, Biroc continues, "is actually two cameras in a single unit photographing separate film strips. These in turn are projected simultaneously with two projectors interlocked to run in unison. While other 3-D systems have employed dual cameras none have pursued the theory that the 3D cameras should see and record the scene exactly as the human eyes can see it. The result, says the camera expert, "is a 3-D picture on the screen that induces no eye strain."

Polaroid spectacles are worn by the audience in viewing the picture, and careful tests have shown that within a matter of seconds viewers forget about the glasses and proceed to enjoy the unprecedented novelty of true third-dimension.

Credit for engineering the dramatic Natural Vision camera equipment goes to Friend Baker, a pioneer in the 3-D field for over 23 years, and camera technician O. S. Bryhn. It was a chance meeting between Baker and M. L. Gunzburg, independent motion picture producer and screen writer, that actually led to the final development of the 35 mm 3-D cameras used to make an actuality of "Bwana Devil."

3-D Makes Them Tone Down Realness

Lensing a motion picture in 3-D presented some unexpected problems for Arch Oboler, producer and famed cameraman Joseph Biroc, who have turned out the first full length feature to be produced in the new dimension, "Bwana Devil." The film, photographed in exciting color, will open at the Theatre. It was necessary to abandon some of the tricks used in ordinary two dimensional films. For example, it was especially important to avoid having objects too much in the foreground, otherwise they might seem to be in the audience's lap. And, it was learned early during the making of the film that extreme realism had to be toned down - otherwise the unparalleled true-to-life picture would, in itself, appear too incredible to be believed.

In Darkest Africa

The major portion of Oboler's unique production was shot in the Belgian Congo and in Kenya and Uganda.



Usually, a girl possessing such beauty and allure as Barbara had, was kept for roles requiring just that. But when given the chance to display her histrionic ability, Barbara took advantage of it. This led to a series of pictures in which she gave fine dramatic performances.

In private life, Barbara is married to Dr. Eugene Czukor, a successful physiotherapist. She is the mother of a five-year-old son, Teddy and a year-old daughter, Chris.
