The work of the wildly gifted Marco Bellochio has been little seen in the U.S. since his two art-circuit hits of the late 60's, FISTS IN THE POCKET and CHINA IS NEAR. He was a member of the documentary group responsible for the powerful FIT TO BE UN-TIED (MVFF, '82) and his latest work, THE EYES, THE MOUTH, will probably hit local screens this fall. Yet LEAP INTO THE VOID, which may be his masterpiece, has never been seen in this area — particularly surprising since it attracted rave notices from critics on its belated New York release last win-In addition, the film boasts stellar performances from Michel Piccoli and Anouk Aimee.

Like all Bellochio's work, **LEAP** exemplifies his belief that "the family as an institution gives rise to madness." Piccoli portrays a fastidious, middle-aged magistrate; Aimee is his beautiful, but emotionally disturbed sister. They've lived together all their lives, and loathe each other for their interdependence. But who is the mad one here?
