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THE STORY

"THE BREAK" EXPLOSIVE DRAMA OF PERFECT CRIME

Intriguing Mystery of Terror And Murder Erupts Into Shattering Climax (Advance)

Local movie fans have a treat in store when "The Break," a Union Films release starts its engagement at the Theatre, on..... The picture, a dramatic story of a mystery fugitive bent on the 'perfect crime' shatters all convention by embarking on a series of crimes of staccato proportions.

There have been many films in the past that have attempted to convey 'the perfect crime' theme, but rarely have any of these touched so strongly on this subject as "The Break."

Based on Pip and Jane Baker's screenplay, the picture presents a fascinating study of the lives of a handful of troubled people. A prisoner travelling by train under escort, breaks away from his guards. Killing one of them, he jumps from the train and is nicked up and secreted to a hideout, which is basically a farmhouse. Two men and a girl arrive, ostensibly for a quiet holiday. The girl is actually the escaped prisoner's sister who came to meet him, bringing with her the money her brother had stolen. One of the men is to be paid some of this money to help in the escape out of the country. It is apparent that the farm is also a front for a tremenodus operation in stolen whiskey. When the sister discovers that one of the guests is a private detective, her brother is warned and subsequently kills him. When searchers find the body it is decided that it was an accident. The murder is almost uncovered by a not-too-bright henchman who is also killed by the escaped prisoner. This additional murder is witnessed by one of the visitors. He is pursued by the murderer who is given the slip. The pursued attempts to gain the help of the pursuer's sister. She does not believe at first that her brother is a murderer, but when he attempts to flee the country she rejects him. Overpowering her, the brother forces her towards the river. Hot in pursuit, the pursued now tangles with the brother who pushes him into the river. It would be unfair to divulge the ending here. The shattering climax to a most unusual film should be enjoyed in your local theatre.

for Greg. It is from his wife asking for a divorce. The guests are waited on at table by Jean, Tredgar's

wife. The rest of the staff consists of Moses, a slowwitted character who is continually mumbling hymns, and

his sister Sarah, who is dumb.

Greg, returning to his room, finds Pearson searching

through his cases and admits that he is the person who is acting for his wife (a private detective). Later Greg reveals to Sue that Pearson is a detective, and she, thinking he is after Jacko, goes to warn him without realising she is interrupting a little tête-a-tête with Jean. Jacko tells Sue that

from the quarry, go to meet a large van from which they unload cases of stolen whisky and stack them in the shed. Tredgar plans to smuggle them over to France. Pearson's suspicions are aroused by flashing lights, and true to his nature as a policeman, has to investigate. He locates the activities and is surprised by Jacko who hits and pushes

him over the edge of the quarry. In the morning Pearson is missed. Searchers find his

body, and Tredgar suggests he had an accidental fall. Moses insists that the body should lie in the local church. Seizing his opportunity he gets the body into the Landrover. Jacko tries to stop him and is shot at by Moses. In the ensuing struggle Moses is killed. Greg has followed and has seen the occurence which he reports to Tredgar. They find Jacko, who threatens Greg's life; by successfully manoeuvring, Greg locks Jacko and Tredgar into the barn and finally runs to the moors for escape. Jacko forces the barn doors with the Landrover and follows Greg to the moors. Greg finally escapes the pursuing Landrover, and makes his way back to the farmhouse. Knowing that he will be noticed if he goes to his own room, he attracts Sue's attention to try and persuade her to go with him away from

Unaware that Jacko is her brother, he tells her of the the farm. murder. She first refuses to believe him saying that she is leaving with Jacko. When he calls, as time has arrived for them to leave the farmhouse, she does not want to go and Jacko has to force her with him, as he has a strange
