These two films are the epitome of the German studio production, with light used for allegorical significance. The battles between the forces of good and evil are strongly differentiated by light and shadow contrasts. Lang's architechtural training is very much in effect and the impressive sets make the visual impact of the films particularly outstanding.

It is the dawn of time when dragons roam the still-forming Earth. The Nibelungs, a race of dwarfs, bestow on the mighty warrier, Siegfried, certain magical powers. His powers are heard of far and wide. He meets the hauntingly beautiful Kriemhild and marries her. Ultimately Siegfried, after an incredible fight with a dragon, is slain by the Hagen, who pierces his heart with a spear.

KRIEMHILD'S REVENGE (DIE NIBELUNGEN – PART 2)

Despondent over the slaying of her husband, Kriembild sets out for revenge. She tracks down Hagen, her husband's murderer, through an albance with Attila the Hun. In a wild orgy of violence, Kriembild leads first the siege and then the massacre of Hagen's forces in one of the most brilliant and forceful films of Lang's career.
