Ali is eager to make a fortune in business, but quickly loses the family savings while Aziza toils at home in the traditional role of homemaker and while the uncle works in a sweatshop. The uncle quickly loses his health and eventually dies leaving Ali and Aziza to decide their fates. After a showdown with her cousin, Aziza makes a courageous decision to leave and strike out on her own. She moves in with a friend and lands a job in a textile factory, an emancipated and modern woman. Aziza's story is also the story of Tunisia's struggle to obtain its own modern identity.
