BOWERY BOYS ROAM JUNGLE TO LOCATE DIAMOND CACHE

The Bowery Boys, headed by Leo Gorcey and Huntz Hall, lose themselves in the darkest depths of the African jungles in their latest Allied Artists comedy, "Jungle Gents," now at the theatre.

Their predicament, of course, is the result of Hall's mad blunderings, and a strange *

power with which he is suddenly possessed.

Hall, as Sach, has a nose that can smell diamonds, and he and the rest of the boys, with Louie of the Sweetshop, are hired to find a great diamond cache hidden in jungle caves.

It doesn't help matters a bit when Hall loses the map that might have led them to the diamond caves, and they find themselves wandering for days amid wild animals, native cannibals, and weird voodoo medicine men

To their rescue comes something very nice indeed. It is in the female form of sultry Laurette Luez, a daughter of the jungle, clad only in a leopard skin, who as Tarzana, eventually leads Leo and his clan to the treasure caves, and at the same time leads Sach to the brink of moral ruin. But just to the brink.

An element of actual danger entered into the filming of the amusing and exciting comedy, for a very live and real lion roamed almost at large on one of the Allied Artists stages while the picture was being made.

Stage doors were barred against any one not connected with the company on the days the heavily maned animal worked, and all concerned were more than somewhat relieved when the potential man-killer finished its menacing chores.

Synopsis (Not For Publication)

Suddenly it is discovered that Sach (Huntz Hall) has a miraculous olfactory sense. He can smell diamonds. Inevitably he. Slip (Leo Gorcey), Chuck (David Condon), Butch (Bennie Bartlett) and Louie (Bernard Gorcey) get to Africa, where Sach is hired by Mr. Grimshaw (Patrick Moore), to find a fortune in stolen diamonds, buried in certain remote jungle caves. Lion Loose On Sound Stages

A lion roamed loose on the sound stages for two days while the Bowery Boys, headed by Leo Gorcey and Huntz Hall, filmed their latest comedy for Allied Artists.

The picture, "Jungle Gents," is the current feature at the theatre.

The lion was a necessary prop, for in the fast-moving story the boys are deep in the African jungles, on the hunt for a fortune in diamonds cached in a secret cave.

Seeking it, they become lost when Hall burns their only map, but they are led to safety when they happen to meet a true daughter of the jungle, played by Laurette Luez.

As for the diamonds, they eventually find them quite easily, for Hall has an olfactory power beyond that of the average human. He can smell diamonds, and his ultra-sensitive nose leads them di-

In their antic pursuit of comedy, the Bowery Boys, headed by Leo Gorcey and Huntz Hall, have left few places unvisited outside of Iron Curtain zones.

In Allied Artists' "Jungle Gents," their latest laugh hit now at the theatre, they get lost deep in the

African jungles with results that * range from the hilarious to the hysterical.

The African jungle jaunt for the Bowery group begins when it is discovered that Sach, portrayed by Huntz Hall, has an unusual olfactory sense. He can smell diamonds, like a bloodhound can track down a criminal. He and his mates are hired by a fortune hunter to locate a treasure in gems believed to be hidden in some remote jungle caves indicated on an old and valuable map.

When, as might be expected, Hall burns the map to start a camp fire, the safari is lost and helpless until rescue comes in the lovely form of Tarzana, a primitive girl of the jungles, played, in leopard skin, by Laurette Luez.
