This film deals with upper class comportment in Poland just before the last war and during it. It sketches interclass relations and coming of age of an upper-class, meandering boy and a lower class girl who has married well. Its theme and rather melodramatic treatment make this a chancey item abroad except for some lingo

or arty spots.

Pic is well mounted and displays a good feeling for the period and the disorientation of the upper classes. In keeping with the so-called new freedom in Poland, this tries to show both sides of the question, and leaves its hero a fairly sympathetic character. Acting is good and direction knowing if somewhat overdone in its nostalgia for early periods and its black painting of most of the upper classes. It emerges a curio item at best.
