

TELEGRAFISTEN THE TELEGRAPHIST

The Telegraphistis Knut Hamsun's story of Rolandsen, telegraphist and inventor, who aspires to get rich through his scientific discoveries and thus win the heart of Elise Mack, the beautiful daughter of the trading centre's tycoon. This film takes delight in the exploits of Rolandsen, an early 20th-century everyman who is by turns a lovable fool, a crank philosopher, a shrewd womanizer and a compasionate man. In short, Rolandsen is wonderfully unpredictable. The story takes place in the summer of 1903 on the coast of northern Norway. It is a time of stunning visual clarity and pastoral beauty, with the midnight sun in the sky and the passions running deep. The clock is striking the eleventh hour, the last chance to fulfill dreams.



Erik Gustavson was born in 1955 and started his film career in 1974, working his way up from camera assistant and still photographer to production manager and assistant director before starting his own production company in 1980. In 1984 he won the national film award, Amanda, for his

short film Rendezvous. He made his debut as a feature film director with Blackout (1986), a film noir pastiche. His second feature, Herman (1990), the story of an adolescent boy in early 60s Norway, was a huge hit in Norway, and won two Amanda awards, for best film and screenplay. He began developing The Telegraphist (Telegrafisten) with writer Lars Saabye Christensen in 1990 when the son of Nobel Laureate Knut Hamsun encouraged him to consider his father's novel, Dreamers (Sværmere).
