Positive" is the first of three feature-length docus about the AIDS epidemic made in the U.S. by German director Rosa von Praunheim. As such it will be widely seen and used by everyone interested in the subject, but probably by few others.

Von Praunheim features a number of key AIDS activists, including writer Larry Kramer, founder of a self-help group, who makes extraordinary accusations against former New York mayor Ed Koch), and docu film director Phil Zwickler ("Rights and Reactions"). Also featured is singer Michael Callen, one of the longest survivors of AIDS.
