Mika, the other half of the dynamic Kaurismäki duet who were our Spotlight directors in 1988, returns with Finland's largest production, a film shot on location that spans the earth's two hemispheres, starting in the gloomy landscape of Finland and ending in the lush, tropical rainforest of Brazil. Told with great compassion, Amazon is the story of two men who, for different reasons, set out in search of gold. When they discover that the land is unwilling to yield its riches without exacting a price, they realise that the real gold is the forest itself. Kari is the branch manager of a bank in Helsinki with a terminally ill wife in hospital. Deciding to take radical action, Kari robs his own bank, ends his wife's suffering and plans to leave for America with his two daughters. Accidentally they end up in Brazil, and Kari's spiritual voyage begins. Robbed on arrival, the threesome end up in the care of a taxi driver whose stories of gold deep in the heart of Brazil seem to offer Kari a way to make some quick money. Linking up with an American airborne cowboy, Kari sets out to mine gold. However, his neat plans are sidetracked when he meets a teacher who is determined to protect the rainforest from voracious speculators and miners. The two fall in love, and Kari realises that there are more important things than making money. Beautifully photographed to capture the timeless riches of the Amazonian rainforest, Mika leads us through a process of de-culturalization, forcing us to confront issues that threaten our existence.

Mika Kaurismäki was born in 1955. He has worked as a film director, producer and managing director. From 1977-81, he worked at Hochschule lur Fernsehen und Film, Munich, and from 1981 he worked as a managing director and film director at Villealfa Filmproductions Oy. H.s first film, The Liar (80), earned him the Risto Jarva Prize at the Tampere International Short Film Festival and the Prix Special du Jury at Rencontres International Henri Langlois in Tours, France. His first feature film, The Worthless, won the Jussi statuette for the best Finnish film in 1983. In 1986 and 1988 he won the Jussi statuette for Rosso and Helsinki Napoli All Night Long respectively.
