A restoration from the Museum of Modern Art in New York visual stylist Vincente Minnelli's charming, affectionate Valentine to picture-postcard family values during one pivotal year in the life of the Smith family in turn-ofthe-century St. Louis. A warm and appealing family album brought to life, shot in rich, ravishing Technicolor, with a fine, nostalgic sense of period. A radiant Judy Garland is at the peak of her talents singing Hugh Martin and Ralph Blane's tuneful score, which features two classic numbers, the lively 'Trolley Song' and the wistful 'The Boy Next Door'. Lucille Bremer has her finest cinematic moment as oldest sister Rose, but pint-sized Margaret O'Brien steals the show as mischievous little sister Tootie; her Halloween snowmen are a memorable evocation of childhood fears.
