This sequel to Godard's popular 1965 film *Alphaville* catches up with Lemmy Caution (Eddie Constantine, in his last role) in East Berlin after the fall of the Berlin Wall. The last spy of the Cold War emerges from the small East German town where he was planted as a mole for fifty years, and travels through a wintry landscape of mislaid memories and left-over communists, trying to make his way back toward a West which is busy decorating its well stocked shop windows for Christmas. Both a meditation on history and celebration of Germany's cultural past, **Germany Year 90 Nine Zero** uses the form of a spy thriller to paint a brilliant portrait of collective ennui following the end of an era.
