Cannes — This is a highly stylized art pic with no dialog, giving an impressionistic recreation of the Spanish court after the discovery of America.

Risquez uses lotsa tilted camera angles and ponderously slow scans of the court, sometimes slipping into static poses simulating famous Velázquez paintings.

In lieu of a plot, we see the court botanist puttering about with exotic plants brought from the New World, a real live native who wanders about the palace and eventually is baptized in an elaborate church ceremony, shots of court jesters and nuns (toting heavy lipstick) and other miscellanea.

What the point of it all is may be lost on most viewers of this low-budget item. Commercial prospects seem pretty remote. — Besa.
