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POET AND TSAR

(MUSSIAN MADE) (WITH SONGS)

(In Russian, with English Titles) Story-telling ability of Russian film producers shows macked advancement in this feature, dipicting the further adventures of Young Pushking after the famed Russ poet quit college and carried his revolutionary ideas into the outside world> Chief regret is that such vigorous acting, direction and ali-round yeur man production should be wasted on the revolutionary theme, which has been worn threadbare by Soviet producers. Vehicle is most effectual in individual portrayals and its swift passages and battle spectacle climax.

Pushkin's 'A Voyage to Arzrum, as it traces the poetical genius' utter deflance of Nicholas I, then Czar. It's a sequel to 'Young Pushkin; successful vehicle of about a year ago, which depicted the youthful poet as a student when his revolutionary ideas were taking form. Producers seemingly waver between telling a story strictly for entertainment and attempting to inject the propaganda slant.

Yarn winds up with Pushkin not getting far with his wild ideas and his friends receiving even worse treatment. Way the ending is clipped, as he despairs over treatment meted out by Russian troops, indicates that there may be another in this series about the poet.

Besides D. Zhuravlev's vivid portrayal of Pushkin there are several other sharply defined acting contributions. Villain of the piece, whose identity is never clearly re-

way in which the plot is developed and kept moving is praiseworthy in comparison with previous Russ cinema efforts. Photography is not as good as usual, nor is some of the sound recording. Many scenes represent care and high expenditure for costumes and sets. Sweep of the climaxial battle is the most realistic from Soviet producers in some time.
