"THE BALLAD OF ORIN" A FILM BY MASAHIRO SHINODA



Synopsis

Early spring, 1918. Orin, a blind itinerant singer, encounters a

traveler, Heitaro, at a deserted shrine on the Japan Sea Coast. A kind man,

he guides her from town to town, visiting shops to sing and chant stories.

Orin relates her story to him: At the age of four, she had been pledged

to the goze (a sect of blind itinerant singers). In the late 19th century, these

itinerant musicians evolved a highly ritualized way of life reminiscent of the

codified lifestyles developed by geisha or samurai. Expected to remain chaste,

Orin was banished from the group after succumbing to the advances of a man.

Forced to travel alone, or with another single goze, Orin allows herself to

submit to any man seeking to take advantage of her blind condition.

Heitaro is different. He neither demands sex from her nor allows her to

be used by others. While Orin sings, Heitaro pours customers drinks and

collects coins from them. He buys tools to make clogs, then a cart to carry

their luggage. Travelling together they are taken for a couple. At a

festival however, Heitaro is taken away by gangsters seeking to collect

tariff from him. While he is away a salesman takes advantage of Orin in the

forest. Heitaro returns; infuriated he kills the salesman and himself must

flee the police. Orin is once again left to travel alone.

Heitaro is now a fugitive wanted by the police for murder and by the

army for his previous desertion. When Orin arrives at a shrine in Wakasa

accompanied by another itinerant singer, her name is called from among the

crowd. It is Heitaro. They resume travelling together. Orin is at last

happy - until Heitaro is betrayed by some villagers and captured by the

military. After being arrested and cruelly interrogated, Orin is crushed and

alone. Freed, she returns to her one-time home - now deserted.
