Jean-Luc Godard always said that BREATHLESS was his version of Hawks' SCARFACE, plus a little... it was the "plus a little" reflected in hand-held shooting, improvised acting, and jagged cutting that so shocked viewers in 1959/1960. Now these innovations have been incorporated into the basic grammar of contemporary filmmaking, so that, seen today, BREATHLESS looks positively classical—not too far removed in narrative conception, even in existential content, from an American B-Budget film noir, like GUN CRAZY for that matter. In any case, BREATHLESS remains an essential work of the French New Wave and its most gifted exponent.
