7:20 Nakano Spy School (Rikugun Nakano gakkoo, 1966) West Coast Premiere A spy-vs.-spy noir set in 1938 at the start of the Sino-Japanese War, starring Raizo Ichikawa as a young second lieutenant who accepts a mysterious assignment which fatally estranges him from his sweetheart.

5:30 A False Student (Nise daigakusei, 1960)

Based on a novel by Kenzaburo Oe. After repeatedly failing college entrance exams, Otsu (Jerry Fujio) convinces himself and others that he is a student. Things take an extraordinary turn when he is thought to be a police informer in the midst of a Maoist study group.

7:20 Black Superexpress

(Kuro no chotokkyu, 1964)

WEST COAST PREMIERE

This deeply cynical finale to Daiei's popular "Black" film series on industrial espionage and corrupt business tactics unveils a Japan of schemers, con men and blackmailers. As one character says, "Mercy won't get you big money."

5:30 Red Angel (Akai tenshi, 1966) WEST COAST PREMIERE


