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NANIWA ELEGY (OSAKA ELEGY) 9:30

Naniwa is the old name for Osaka, the setting for this story : young telephone operator who allows herself to be seduced boss in order to help her family financially. In his Diction Films, the French historian George Sadoul notes of NA ELEGY: "The main thread of Mizoguchi's work begins to appear this film: the depiction of society and the condition of women that society. It marks also his search for a 'new realism,' a d task under a militaristic government concerned only with 'ideo films. In fact, it was banned by the government censors in 1940 'decadent tendencies.' When Mizoguchi said late in his life, found my true voice after I was 40,' he was undoubtedly thin this film, a simple story, simply directed. It is the first film or he worked with Yoshikata Yoda, whose sympathies were clos own and whose collaboration he valued highly. He also recalle the 'passion and devotion to her work' of the actress Isuzu Y whose role was written for her and who gives an extraoperformance as a modern woman struggling against commen tion. The film is an incomparable artistic achievement, match best work of Jean Renoir at this time and, like Renoir's film: profound sense of social realities."
