Vivid account of the last years of the rule of Abdul-Hamid II, Sultan of Turkey (Fritz Kortner) in the early 1900s. Abdul recalls the leaders of the Young Turk party from exile to form a democratic government, but engineers the assassination of the leader of the rival Old Turk party, so that the new government is overthrown and its leaders executed. The assassin, Kadar (Nils Asther) chief of police, has also wounded Talak, a Turkish officer (John Stuart) – a grave mistake, for Talak is eventually responsible for Abdul's downfall.
