


In China during the 13th Century, the country is under the domination of a Tartar tyrant, Garak, who murdered the Emperor and set himself up as the all-powerful prime minister. Wanting more power, he plots to also murder the young teen-age Imperial Prince Ti-sung and his beautiful sister, the Princess Lei-ling (YOKO TANI) and install himself as emperor.

The only opposition to the Tartar despot was a small group of guerrillas, outarmed and outmanned by the Tartars. They are under the leadership of a young and ardent rebel, Cho, who can do little more than annoy his people's oppressors. Meanwhile Garak plans to kill off the young Prince and Princess, by ambushing the Prince on a hunting party, and placing the Princess in a remote convent where she would be murdered by his Tartar soldiers.

The ambush plot is upset by the sudden appearance of a mysterious stranger, Samson (GORDON SCOTT) who displays remarkable and heroic strength by single-handedly beating off the attacking Tartars and killing a savage tiger with his bare hands to save the young prince. Samson brings the wounded Prince to a nearby convent which he learns is the headquarters of Cho's rebel band. There they plot to make Garak believe his plot to kill the Prince has been successful by sending him the torn royal clothing. Samson also learns of the plot against the Princess and then decides to join with the rebels, lending them his prodigious strength, to help them overthrow the Tartar

Garak's plot to kill the Princess fails, but later his guards capture her and he decides to marry her to legitimize his claim to the throne of China. When Samson and Cho learn of Garak's new plan to marry the Princess, they decide to act quickly to foil the plot. Samson decides to go to Peking to try to rescue the Princess and ring the Gong of Freedom while Cho mobilizes a rebel army to attack the Tartars, with the help of the Prince.

Samson enters the city and performs amazing and miraculous feats of strength to beat off all attempts to capture him. He finally rings the Gong of Freedom and rescues the Princess as the inspired people of China rally behind Cho and the Prince to defeat Garak and his Tartar oppressors.



He was born Gordon M. Werschkul on August 3, 1927, in Portland, Oregon. He was the youngest of nine children, all of whom emulated their father who was an all-around athlete and who taught Gordon and his brothers and sisters to be proficient in all sports.

After an elementary and high school education in local Portland schools, Gordon attended the University of Oregon until World War II broke out and then joined the U.S. Army where he served until 1947. After his army service, he worked at numerous and varied jobs from a bottling factory worker to a salesman for a farm implement company.


Gordon also was a fireman for a while and then a cowboy, and finally moved on to an expensive Las Vegas, Nevada, hotel where he worked as swimming and diving instructor.

It was at Las Vegas that the six-foot, three inch, 212-pound muscular Scott was spotted by a Hollywood agent, scouting for a new Tarzan for Sol Lesser Productions which was planning a new series of motion pictures featuring the Edgar Rice Burroughs

Gordon was invited to audition the very next day for the Tarzan role. As he describes it, "They ran me ragged. They chased me up and down trees and in and out of water, and at the end of the day they told me I had the job."

It was his first motion picture, titled "Tarzan's Hidden Jungle" and he made four more jungle pictures in succeeding years, the latest of which was called "Tarzan the Magnificent."

Now Gordon doffs his jungle loincloth for an Oriental version to take on Tartar warriors and treacherous Oriental politicians and make love to beautiful Chinese women as the world's strongest man in "Samson and the Seven Miracles of the World." 



YOKO TANI INTRODUCED PARIS TO JAPANESE STRIP TEASE

Tantalizing Yoko Tani, whose name means "Child of the Ocean" in Japanese, made her debut in show business by introducing the first Japanese strip tease ever presented in Paris.


Miss Tani, or Tani Yoko San as she is addressed in polite Japanese, was born in Paris, France, where he father was stationed with the Nipponese embassy. She visited her homeland for the first time when she was five years old, a Japanese child who spoke only French.

She soon after learned not only Japanese but English, too, and later majored in Japanese literature at Tokyo's Tsudo College and then won a scholarship at Paris' famed Sorbonne University as an art major. The pretty little five foot, two inch Japanese student went broke after three years of studying art and ballet and decided to put her shapely 36-20-36 measurements to practical use with a spectacular bid for show business fame — by introducing the first Japanese strip tease ever presented in Paris.


Soon afterward she made her first stage appearance and then appeared in numerous French films, including a starring role in "Paris Mannequin." Miss Tani returned home for a while to star in four Japanese films and then went back to Paris and later to Rome for her first American film, "The Quiet American" and as Sabby in "The Wind Cannot Read."

On her first visit to Hollywood she made her next and most important American film, in the starring role of the Eskimo wife opposite Anthony Quinn in Paramount's "The Savage Innocents." She also starred with Shirley MacLaine in "My Geisha" and most recently with Rory Calhoun in American International's "Marco Polo."

The provocatively figured Miss Tani speaks English with a French accent and has maintained her interests and talents for flower arrangements, tea ceremonies, dancing, singing, music and strip teasing as a result of her varied career and background. Despite the fact that she has spent most of her life away from her native land and in Europe, she still proudly describes herself as "an Asiatic."
