Wide Screening The Canterbury Tales

The Canterbury Tales is definitely not for every taste. What some viewers will see as enthrallingly earthy others will find tastelessly obscene. Pier Paolo Pasolini, the tilm's writer-director often had just this sort of effect on audiences. Whatever else it is, The Canterbury Tales is a iascinating work by one of the international cinema's most original talents. The film, made in 1972, is only now finding its way here--it's American premiere engagement is at the Screening Room.

Pasolini's last film (the director was brutally murdered a few years ago) Salo has still to be released in Lie U.S.

Pasolini himself portrays Chaucer, appearing throughout, quill in hand ready to jot down the latest tale. As his hands the tales range from the cinematically inventive The Merchant's Tale (with Hugh Griffith) and the absurdly comic The Student's Tale to the quite indescribable Summoner's Tale.

Throughout all this there is a great deal of nudity, ripe language and what not-the movie certainly earned it's X rating.
