'Smiles' Is Gay Spoof, Sparkles With Sex

(Review)

From a sparkling start to a hilarious finish, the new presentation of the AB Svensk Film-industri Production of "Smiles Of A Summer Night," at

the Theatre, is a happy, gay story performed by a talented cast of Swedish performers.

The film, the Grand Prix Award winner for Best Comedy at the International Cannes Film Festival, has all the fascination and style of a Restoration or Oscar Wilde comedy. It's theme, handled in a light and satirical vein, is that of infidelity and it tells of the amatory affairs of its characters in a brilliant and daring manner.

"Smiles Of A Summer Night" has a stellar, top-drawer cast headed by four of Sweden's most beautiful blonde actresses—Ulla Jacobsson, Eva Dahlbeck, Harriet Andersson and Margit Carlquist — while the male leads in this situation comedy, easily one of the best of the year, are Gunnar Bjornstrand and Jarl Kulle.


This entertaining Swedish film tells about a successful, self-centered, lustful lawyer, portrayed by Gunnar Bjornstrand, who is living in a platonic marriage with his beautiful but unawakened 18 - year - old second wife, Miss Jacobsson. The attorney has a son of the same age as his wife, and the equally unawakened young man whom their pretty maid, Miss Andersson, is doing her best to familiarize with the facts of life.

This situation is interrupted when Eva Dahlbeck, a famous actress who had once been the lawyer's mistress arrives in town. Miss Dahlbeck, at this time is now the mistress of a titled Count, Jarl Kulle, who is also having domestic problems with his young wife, Margit Carlquist. Matters come to a hilarious climax when the jealous Kulle catches Bjornstrand in an illicit affair with Miss Carlquist. Over a bottle of brandy, both men partake in a game of Russian roulette, but to tell the ending would spoil the fun. You would have to visit the

Born in Gothenberg, she acted for several years in the local theatre, and since then has appeared in Swedish as well as German motion pictures.


Eva Dahlbeck Is Versatile Actress

Miss Andersson, in the film, "Smiles Of A Summer Night," portrays the role of a frolic-some maid.

Miss Andersson started her acting career only four years ago in Sweden when she became associated with the Municipal Theatre of Malmo. Critical acclaim was afforded her for her role of Hedwig in Ibsen's "The Wild Duck," and since then, she has been warmly received by international audiences.

Dramatic Actress Is A Comical Delight

One of the leading lights of the Dramatic Theatre of Stockholm is Margit Carlquist, who is outstanding in the comedy "Smiles Of A Summer Night," at the Theatre.

Miss Carlquist, who is featured as Charlotte, the Countess in "S miles Of A Summer Night," is 24, and is already an outstanding success of the stage in Sweden and Europe. She has appeared in a number of films and is frequently heard on radio in Sweden.

The Story:

Fredrick Egerman (Gunnar Bjornstrand), a successful self-centered, lustful lawyer is living a platonic marriage with his beautiful but virginal 18-year-old second wife, Anne, (Ulla Jacobsson). By his previous marriage, Egerman has a son, Henrik (Bjorn Bjelvenstam), who is the same age as Anne, and like her, is also naive and unawakened to the facts of life. However, Petra (Harriet Andersson), the Egerman family maid, is doing her best to familiarize Henrik to the why's and wherefore's of the birds and bees.

This situation is interrupted when Desiree Armfeldt (Eva Dahlbeck), a famous actress who had been Egerman's mistress, visits the dull township where he lives. Unknown to Egerman is that Desiree has borne him a son following a previous visit.

Egerman takes his young wife to see Desiree perform in the local theatre, but Anne leaves midway during the show suspecting that her husband and the actress have some mutual bond and unknown relationship. After taking his wife home and putting her to bed, Egerman slips out of the house to call on Desiree. His visit is interrupted when the actress' current lover, Count Malcolm (Jarl Kulle) makes an unexpected arrival.

Desiree realizes that she loves and wants Egerman, and embarks on a plan to break up the lawyer's current marriage. Her plot comes to a head at a weekend party given by Desiree's mother in her country home. The Count's wife, Margit Carquist, lures Egerman into a passionate encounter so that her husband would become jealous and drop Desiree. An exqually passionate but unexpected encounter takes place between Anne and Henrik.

Petra, the maid, meanwhile winds up in a frolicsome affair with Desiree's groom.

Matters come to a climax when Egerman is caught by the jealous Count in the illicit affair with the Countess. Over a bottle of brandy, both men partake in a game of Russian roulette. Desiree, who has manipulated the strings of her plot with success, stops the game when the Count decides to return to his Countess, Anne runs off with Henrik, Egerman realizes that he loves the actress, and Petra is happy with her groom.






