' Chris Marker has made documentaries at home in France and laboard and has developed a distinctive style in a kind of cinematic essay. He mixes visual metaphor, intellectual comment, general musings, for a counterpoint of image and idea. Though sometimes mannered it usually escapes preciosity by a saving wit, generosity and urbanity.

. Here he looks at Japan during the Olympics through a comely igirl, one Muroaka Koumiko. The camera all but caresses her as an lunseen man asks questions, shows her at liberty or wondering about life, situations and men. In between are smartly lensed looks at Japanese life, physical aspects, and, through it all, a sort of love

affair with the girl.

Somehow it comprises a general comment on Japan's many facets; its aping of the West, that is now assimilated, its exotica and everyday look and a generally clever, if surface, summing up of a charming but yet reserved and, finally, mysterious young girl whose faulty French and bland and innocent feelings are beguiling.

Short length of this feature documentary gives it some chance Mosk. for pairing in U.S.
