With his acerbic sense of humour, mordant wit, and his ability to mix the bittersweet with the tragicomic, Aki Kaurismäki has garnered a worldwide reputation as one of contemporary cinema's most brilliant clown-poets. La vie de bohème, loosely based on the same story as Puccini's opera (Kaurismäki calls it his "revenge" on Puccini), shows him at the height of his powers; it's a funny, sardonic picaresque that follows the misfortunes of three down-and-out artists living the not-so-romantic bohemian life in Paris. Rodolfo, a refugee from Albania and a "great" painter, Marcel, a "great" French poet, and Schaunard, a "great" Irish composer, meet by chance while chasing the ever-elusive franc and avoiding creditors. They become drinking companions and fast friends. Enter Mimi and Musette, two country belles lost in the maelstrom of the big city. This being a "melancholy comedy which, incidentally, is actually a melodrama" (Kaurismäki), romance soon gives way to tragedy. . . .

Shot in evocative black-and-white with direction and décor that range from the surreal and the kitschy to the sublime, La vie de bohème is vintage Kaurismäki.
