THE STORY (Not for Publication)

Max Brandt (ZACHARY SCOTT), a convicted murderer, escapes from the custody of the police guard. With his confederate Duke (LEE PATTERSON), Brandt immediately seeks out the home of Louie (MERVYN JOHNS), a wartime acquaintance. Louie, an expert forger is frightened to find that Brandt expects him to join him in a large scale counterfeiting operation. The cellar of Louie's country home in Sussex is converted into a workshop and Louie is blackmailed by Max into starting work on the forging of plates for £5 notes. The correct paper texture, the colour of the ink and the perfection of the copying all involve a good deal of painstaking labor and it is some time before the trio are satisfied that they have produced a perfect facsimile of the real thing. Throughout the whole operation Max is irritated by the presence in the house of Louie's housekeeper (CHILI BOUCHIER) and the arrival at the house of Louie's daughter Carol (PEGGIE CASTLE) increases his anxiety. Determined that the secret of his ruthlessly calculated plans shall not be disclosed he murders the housekeeper and threatens Carol that should she attempt to call the police, her father will also die. Having produced a vast quantity of counterfeit notes, arrangements are made to distribute them on a wholesale basis to racketeers and crooked businessmen throughout the country. To arrange this distribution Max employs a "staff" of salesmen and forms a legitimate company as a cover for their illegal activities. The first attempts to pass the forged notes meet with the terrific success and the gang step up their production, flooding the country with counterfeit money. Meanwhile Carol, desperately seeking to persuade her father to quit the gang tries to destroy the printing plates but is violently prevented by Max. Louie, shaken by the attack on his daughter sends one of the forged £5 notes to the police, exposing the whole set-up. Detectives race to the house to find Max, having shot and wounded Louie, involved in a gun fight with Bob (ROBERT ARDEN), Carol's boy friend. Max and Duke, shooting frantically, manage to escape to a jeep. Trying to avoid a head-on collision with a police car however, the jeep crashes through a hedge, bounces over a cliff and plungs into a sheer drop of hundreds of feet.



Back in school Peggie Castle used to play boy's roles. Of course, those days are gone forever. But the shapely Miss Castle explains that in her younger days she attended an all-

girl's school and someone had to be the boy.

Peggy, who co-stars with Zachary Scott in "The Counterfeit Plan," which opens at the

story of five men and a woman who plan to shake down two continents for one hundred million dollars.

Scott, as the leader of the gang, is not unfamiliar in the role of a villain on the screen. His first film, "The Mask of Dimitrios," established his rugged good looks as good "bad man" material. Subsequently he has played menacing roles in such noteable successes as "Mildred Pierce," "Ruthless" and "Unfaithful."

The tall, green-eyed, blonde Miss Castle was first seen in 1950, when she debuted for Elliott Nugent in "Belvedere Goes to College" and since then she has been seen in such films as "I, The Jury," "Tall Man Riding," "Target Zero," and "Miracle in the Rain," as well as having many appearances on television to her credit. In "The Counterfeit Plan," she is cast as a young artist who becomes implicated with the counterfeiters in order to rescue her father from the gang's clutches.

Seen in supporting roles are Mervyn Johns, Sydney Tafler, and Lee Patterson. "The Counterfeit Plan" was directed by Montgomery Tully from a screenplay by James Eastwood.

Theatre, was actually born into show business, her father being business manager for Donald O'Connor.

Born in Appalachia, Virginia, Peggie attended some 22 schools all over the country, because of her father's numerous changes of residence. She was graduated from Mills College in Oakland, Calif.

Since her film debut in 1950 in "Belvedere Goes to College," after being discovered by Elliott Nugent, Peggie has appeared on television and in many films. Her biggest successes number "I, The Jury," the filmization of the Mickey Spillaine novel, "Tall Man Riding," "Target Zero" and "Miracle in the Rain," the last three named for Warner Bros., for whom she made "The Counterfeit Plan."

Zachary Scott Traded-in Texas Drawl For British Accent To Crash Films

er started Zachary Scott on his way to fame and fortune. The actor who is currently starring in "The Counterfeit Plan," opening at the Theatre, didn't find the proverbial sailing much smoother on the other side of the Atlantic though.

The first few weeks in the English capital were discouraging ones for Zachary Scott. There just weren't any parts for a lad with a Texas accent. Zach got around this obstacle by claiming to be an Australian.

In any event the lad from Texas was given the leading juvenile role in an English Repetory Company's production of "The Outsider," his first professional assignment. During the next 18 months Zachary Scott had appeared in some 20 films and had obtained experience valuable for his successful bid for cinema stardom some years later.

Scott had become so attached to England, so fond of the British people who had given him his first acting opportunity that he nearly settled permanently in that country. However, with parents and a very special girl friend, Elaine Anderson, in the United States he decided to return shortly before his 21st birthday. A few months later he married Elaine.

A trip to England aboard a freight- Scott again ran into accent trouble in seeking a career on the New York stage. During his years in England he had acquired an English accent and now the American producers said he sounded too British.




