SPELLBOUND is an unusual thriller about psychoanalysis that no doubt appeared genuinely daring in 1945. To a certain extent, it must be seen today as a kind of psychological period piece. Ingrid Bergman portrays a frigid analyst, and Gregory Peck plays an amnesiac posing as the renowned psychiatrist he may have murdered. Hitchcock skillfully balances a tender love story against an exciting manhunt. Ben Hecht's screenplay and Salvador Dali's dream sequences provide the Freudian counterpoint. Produced by David O.
