In her seventieth year, Marguerite Duras has not only written a novel, L'amant, which has won the prestigious Prix Goncourt, but she has also written and co-directed the most charming and accessible film of her brilliant forty-year career.

As a novlist, playwright, filmmaker, and screen-writer for such distinguished directors as Resnais, Brook, Dassin, Straub, and Godard, Duras has presented work which has been consistently challenging in its deconstruction of narrative conventions, both literary and cinematic. From her first screenplay, Hiroshima mon amour and in her most loved films, India Song and Le Camion, she has established herself as one of the principal exponents of the cinematic New Narrative, upon which an aesthetic and critical theory of modernism has been founded.

The Children makes a surprising departure from her previous work. Duras approaches her subject, the value of knowledge in a meaningless world, with a whimsically comic and gently human touch. The warm family story is centered around the sad wisdom of a ten-year-old boy (wonderfully played by an adult actor) who refuses to go to school because he doesn't want to learn what he doesn't know.
