telex: 823530 1988/Color/97 min. American Stories is a series of stories, jokes, and memories, told directly to the camera by a collection of New York Jewish actors spanning four generations. Some of the tales are personal; others are hoary old Jewish jokes. All are touched by a sense of transition, the old world hovering on the edge of the new, marked by one and not yet belonging to the other. Simply composed, with characters speaking from street corners, docksides, and vacant lots, the images are sumptuously lit and shot with midnight blues and dense greys, the faces illuminated to emerge from the night backgrounds, the city behind them resembling a stage set. As director Chantal Akerman says, the structure is that of a sonata: "From



one story to the next, one joke to the following, a melodic line appeared...the stories follow one another until the last scene in which they are gathered up in a form of allegretto." - Kay Armatage, Toronto Film Festival
