Pabst explores the moral disintegration of post-war European life in this love story set in Paris and the Crimea during the Russian Civil War. Pabst's eloquent style in expressing the psychology of the individuals concerned and his realistic details capture the decadent atmosphere through symbology and editing. In the story, a French bourgeois woman falls in love with a fiery young Communist, but the affair is thwarted by a scoundrel.

The film contains fine examples of Pabst's technique of editing on movement, where a single gesture takes place in two shots cut together with such smoothness as to give the viewer a sense of extraordinary mobility within the scene.

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
