


A Finnish film ballad from the turn of the 17th century.

"Antti Treebranch" is based on an old Finnish ballad. The story takes place in the wilds of Karelia and the Far North of Finland at the turn of the 17th century and is about a wealthy fur trader who hears a prophecy that a poor tenant farmer's son would inherit his fortune. The trader buys the infant and sets him in a forked branch of a tree, abandoning him to die. However, a hunter finds the child, takes care of him and names him Antti Treebranch.

When Antti has grown to young manhood, he and the fur trader meet again. The fur trader seeks Antti's destruction but – as is bound to happen in good legends – evil meets an evil end and virtue is rewarded.
