Portraying Sybil, a young woman in love with a man whom she cannot quite understand, South African-born Alice Krige makes a most promising feature film debut in "Chariots Of Fire," a Ladd Company and Warner Bros. release thru Warner Bros.

Produced by David Puttnam and directed by Hugh Hudson from a screenplay by Colin Welland, "Chariots Of Fire" is a movie about the passions of men driven to compete.

Although the character Alice portrays on film is an actress, Alice herself came late to such a career, having initially entertained the idea of following in her mother's path and becoming a clinical psychologist.

"When I went to Grahamstown University, South Africa, my parents suggested I do a year of drama for my own pleasure," recalls Alice. "By the time I reached my final year at school, I was averaging 16 hours a day working in the University Theatre."

Alice came to England to study at the Central School on a scholarship in 1976, and three years later, officially embarked on her career with a role in the BBC film, "The Happy Autumn Fields."
